This year's Financial Report truly shows the generosity of this parish family to our mission here in this portion of the Lord's vineyard. It is a testimony to the tremendous leadership of Fr. Joe O'Connor, Fr. Ben Schrantz, and the Pastoral Team. Thank you for all the support you have shown them by sharing your time, talent, and treasure!

As Fr. O'Connor outlined in last year's report, one important thing is to continue to keep our facilities and grounds in good shape so that our mission of building up the Body of Christ in the Baldwinsville community can move forward full speed. One area where this can be seen is our capital projects but can also be found in the continuing evolvement of faith-based programs in our parish, including our parish school and the further fostering of relationships with the parishes of St. Augustine's and St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. Again, this year savings should be found in staff salaries and clergy expenses through shared expenses, especially since the Diocese will pay 67% of my salary and each parish will contribute 11%. This will allow us to continue to rebuild the parish's savings as is most evident in this year's reported "Net Surplus."

Again, just a reminder of how the Hope Appeal Parish Sharing has allowed our parish along with St. Augustine's and St. Elizabeth Ann Seton to have community building activities best seen in the August Mass and Picnic on Paper Mill Island. Your support of parish collections and the Hope Appeal are a major source of fuel for our mission to teach like Jesus and to "Go out to the world and tell the Good News." Thank you for all you do and I feel most privileged to be your pastor. God's Blessings upon all!

- Bereavement Group met weekly on Tuesdays from October-June, and a Wednesday evening group has been added.

YOUTH MINISTRY & FAITH FORMATION: HOPE FOR THE FUTURE!

- Students K-6 met regularly (Elementary classes twice a month)
- 70 youth in grades 6-10 met for Super Sunday
- 35-40 high school youth attended the weekly Quo Vadis program to grow in discipleship
- 16 high school youth attend our first Winter Pilgrimage to Washington D.C.
- 30 youth attended the Steubenville Youth Conference in July 2024 in Steubenville, Ohio
- Youth in grades 6-10 participated in volunteer activities such as the Fish Fry, Syracuse Home, & Turkey Trot

OUTREACH MINISTRIES: HOPE FOR THOSE IN NEED

- Knitter's Group made 200 baptismal stoles, 50 computer sleeves to send to college students and knitted and filled stockings for seminarians.
- Gift cards from Aldi, Tops and Wegmans were collected for families in need at Thanksgiving.
- Supported the charitable efforts of the Christmas Bureau, Peace, and the Baldwinsville Food Pantry.
- Kiwanis Turkey Day Race Food Drive, alongside St. Augustine's and St. Elizabeth Ann Seton supporting local food pantries and the Rotary Back Pack program collected \$78,000 worth of food.
- Homebound Ministry brings the Eucharist to people in our faith community and 5 new ministers were commissioned.
- Celebrated over 45 Masses and Communion Services at Syracuse Home.
- Lenten Fish Fry served 3,000 fish dinners
