
Progress Report to Parishioners on Capital Campaign as of December 31, 2025

The stones and masonry on the exterior of the church have been repaired, and point and patch work is complete.

The concrete block in the bell tower has been repaired/replaced.




The exterior molding around the three rose windows has been refurbished and painted; the exterior molding around all the small windows towards the back of the church was scraped and painted.

We replaced seven church windows that face the street. (New windows were installed; the finishing work around the inside of the windows needs to be completed and we are expecting that to be done this winter.)



Sections of the church roof were repaired to prevent further damage this winter.



Handrails were built and installed on the stairs for the alcoves on the sides of the altar.



We addressed drainage issues that caused water to enter and flood the parish center basement. This included installing drywells on both sides of the parish center entrance, installing gutters and redirecting water on the roof to existing drains.

Flooring and drywall that were damaged by the water infiltration problem were pulled out and replaced. The cost for that was covered by insurance.

Previously Completed Projects

In and around the church, we restored pillars at the entrance to the church, restored and painted the exterior molding around the stained-glass windows on the south side of the church, refinished and repaired six wooden doors, and we purchased and installed air conditioning units in the choir loft. Three new steel man doors installed on the parish garage building. Over at the Academy we installed air conditioning in the classrooms and offices and repaired the brick chimney.
